PRIEST AT PUNGAREHU

ONCE EDITOR OF TABLET

a The death occurred suddenly at an
s early hour yesterday of the Rt. Rev. Dr.
d James Kelly, priest of the Catholic parish
v of Pungarehu, at the age of 60 years. Dr.
- Kelly was ill for only a very short time
- and his death was entirely unexpected.

1 Dr. Kelly, who was a fluent linguist,
2 was a well known member of the Catho-
3 lic clergy and a brilliant scholar, hold-
- ing the degree of Doctor of Philosophy.
l As editor of the New Zealand Tablet
d for over 15 years, Dr. Kelly's work be-
2 came known to Catholics in all parts of
- the Dominion, and on many subjects he
- was recognised as an authority. He re-
- tired from this position about six years
- ago and accepted the charge of the
- Pungarehu parish, where he had re-
s remained ever since. He made at least one
l journey to Rome and was always will-
- ing to offer his advice and assistance to
t others who desired to visit the Italian
s capital.

He was a nephew of the Archbishop of
Sydney, the Most Rev. Michael Kelly.
