A Wellington News media representative travelling with Prince Charles were given the clear impression today that nobody loves them.

Not much more than a shell remains of St Andrew's Presbyterian Church Waverley, which is being demolished to make way for a new church complex.

Demolition of the 103-year-old church, the spire of which is visible from far outside Waverley, began on Monday.

Also to be demolished is St Stephen's Anglican Church at Waverley.

The Anglican and Presbyterian parishes

of the town became a co-operating parish in 1976 and the new complex will be built as a joint venture by the two bodies at an estimated cost of \$90,000.

Both old churches were wooden buildings in need of major repair, but were not of sufficient historic or architectural merit to justify large sums for their preservation, according to the minister of the co-operating parish, Rev. David Clark.
