The carvings which depict Te Rangi-apiti-rua Rangi-Ra-Runga, Takarangi and Raumahora, ancestors of the Ngati-Awa and Taranaki people were conceived and executed by Mr. John Ford, of Hamilton.

The tukutuku work, of the "purapura whetu" pattern (myriad of stars) was done by ladies of St. Mary's supervised by Mrs. M. Crawford of Opunake.

The mat was worked and presented by the Maori Art and Craft Institute of Whakarewarewa.

The cost of the memorial was largely borne by one local family in memory of their mother, while others gave gifts. The totara for the carving was also donated by a local family.
