Top Taranaki sawyer and axeman Merv Jensen collapsed and later died after competing at the Sydney Royal Easter Show yesterday.

Jemsen (68) Plymouth, had just competed in the 375mm wood chapping and sawing contest when he collapsed. He was rushed by ambulance to nearby St Vincent's Rospital, but later died.

A regular competitor at the Easter Show for 10 years, he won the 375mm title in 1978, 1979 and 1980 and was placed second yesterday.

He collapsed before about 1000 spectators and was immediately given heart massage and mouth-to-mouth resuscitation until ambulancemen arrived.

The veteran axeman had been competing in the secand heat of the demanding event won by Melvyn Lentz of the United States. He reeled backwards as he ran to assist him as he slumped to the ground.
