The Scenery Preservation Society
suggested that when leasing the old
military hospital site, provision be
made for preservation of the native
bush there on the banks of the He-
nuui.—Agreed to.

Cr. Brooking, on behalf of Mr San-
derson, asked that an extension of
time be granted to the purchaser of
the old military hospital buildings.
Mr Newton King was the purchaser,
and it was his intention to re-erect
it at Brooklands, and to expend a
good sum of money in putting it in
order.—A month's extension was
granted.

The old building, that was origin-
ally used as a hospital, at Te Henui,
was, on Saturday, sold to Mr C.
Reilly for £9.10s. It would perhaps
have been better had the Board made
a bonfire of the old place.
