

5 instead of 513

Residents in New Plymouth areas with new street names and numbers are happy with the change. They told the Taranaki Herald this today.

The town clerk, Mr W. J. Connor, said about 200 houses would have new numbers. These were in the portion of South Rd from Lawry St to the city boundary.

There would be no number changes in the part of South Rd from Cutfield Rd to Lawry St, which was now St Aubyn St.

Existing numbers in St Aubyn St-South Rd would also apply from the eastern end of St Aubyn St to the intersection with Lawry St.

The number changes would involve houses on South Rd from Lawry St to the city boundary. These would begin at No. 1 near the Lawry St intersection.

The council would supply the new plastic numbers, Mr Connor said. About 90 per cent had been distributed and the rest would be sent out as soon as possible.

No numbers were effected when Paritutu Cres became Centennial Drive, when Huatoki Rd became Huatoki St

and the part of Awanui St from Coronation Ave to the Awanui bridge became Cumberland St, he said.

Mr E. B. Bailey, who will live at 5 South Rd instead of 513, said he delivered papers in the area 45 years ago and thought the change was needed even then.

But a resident of the new length of St Aubyn St, Mrs E. B. Hopson, said although the change was for the good, it was a bit of a nuisance for her because she had such a bad memory.

Mrs F. M. Hancock, said the changeover should have been made nearer Christmas, as "it would have been an easier way of telling my friends."
