Walkway mural taking shape

A CLAY MURAL reflecting the changing landscape of the Huatoki Stream's mouth over the last 150 years is being crafted by New Plymouth Potters' Club members as their contribution to the city's 1991 celebrations.

The completed mural, which is being produced in liaison with the New Plymouth District Council, will be cemented on the wall along the walkway which leads from Pukeariki Landing to Settlers Quay.

Moulded, modelled and sculptured in two dimensions the mural would feature the colonisation, the Maori aspect, the land reclamation, the old railway station and the area around what is now the Centre

today, said Joyce Young".

"We're trying to depict the history of the area — with a bit of artistic licence here and there."
